# **Induction Training September 2022**

As part of the British Council's commitment to supporting teachers in our **Bilingual Education Programme** (BEP) **schools** we will offer a comprehensive induction training programme with courses for all levels throughout September 2022 via live online workshops delivered by British Council experts.

These courses will focus on the main aspects of our BEP methodology and are primarily aimed at teachers who are new or relatively new to a BEP school whether Early Years, Primary or Secondary. All new BEP teachers in 2022-23 or relatively new BEP teachers (ie teachers with 2 or less years experience of working in a BEP school) are strongly encouraged to apply for a place on one of our new induction courses.

#### The BEP Induction training courses:

- Consist of **12 hours** of practical online workshops (6 sessions x 2hrs)
- Take place during **September 2022** (dates and times indicated below)
- Are delivered by British Council experts
- Are open to all new and relatively new Early Years, Primary and Secondary Asesores Lingüisticos / teachers (experienced teachers are welcome to apply but all available places will be allocated first to colleagues with less BEP experience)
- Will cover the essential pillars of BEP methodology to enable new teachers to become
  more familiar with and confident in applying an integrated literacy-based approach to
  their teaching at all levels of Education across the curriculum.

#### Selection criteria. Places will be assigned to teachers who:

- Complete the **online registration form** correctly
- Are new / relatively new (2 years of experience or less) in a BEP School
- Can attend all 6 sessions within the training programme
- Any available places will be then assigned on a first come first served basis to all BEP teachers who apply
- Places on each induction course are limited to 20 participants

We will explore how topic webs will enable Early Years teachers to set relevant objectives for an effective and efficient cross curricular curriculum. We will also

	Building on the planning using our topic webs, we will look at developing varied and engaging learning situations for children in Early Years which include a range of adult led and child led activities. We will explore effective practice in our classrooms			
26.09.22	Session 5: Effective Assessment in BEP Early Years			
	A vital component of child-centred planning is meaningful assessment. We will look at both why and how to we can do this in our BEP classrooms.			
28.09.22	28.09.22 Session 6: Phonics in Early Years			
	We will briefly review why Phonics are key to supporting the development of literacy skills in English and how best to implement phonics teaching and learning in Early Years.

13.09.22	Session 1: A text-based approach to Literacy. Part 1.		
16:00 <b>–</b> 18:00	In the first session we will explore the use of whole texts in BEP primary English classrooms to understand the key characteristics of a successful whole text approach. We will also look at planning language learning objectives through the whole text approach.		
15.09.22	Session 2: A text-based approach to Literacy. Part 2		
	We will take a closer look at some of the <b>worked examples</b> which were developed for BEP Primary classrooms and which exemplify our whole text approach. We will also focus on the different stages in the <b>Talk for Writing</b> approach and how this can be used to help support our planning of learning.		

20.09.22	Session 3: Phonics in Primary		
	Children in BEP Primary classrooms should continue to build their reading and writing skills through continued teaching of Phonics. We will look at why it is important for our learners to continue with their Phonics programme and how we can build Phonics teaching into our classes.		
22.09.22	Session 4: Building cross-curricular links. Part 1.  We will continue to focus on our worked examples with a closer look at ideas for planning and developing cross curricular links with Arts and Crafts.		
26.09.22	Session 5: Building cross-curricular links. Part 2.		
	We will continue to use our worked examples and take a closer look at ideas for planning and developing cross curricular links with <b>Science.</b>		
28.09.22	Session 6: Effective Assessment for Learning Assessment needs to contribute to learning and in this session we will look at best practice in formative assessment. We will explore the importance of creating and sharing relevant assessment criteria for improved student outcomes in our BEP Primary classrooms.

	This session will explore a key feature of BEP Secondary; the collaboration and coordination between departments as subject and English teachers work			

	together on building Literacy across all subjects and include cross-curricular projects in their plans.			
15.09.22	Joint session 3: Motivation and encouragement			
	In this session, we'll consider how to motivate and engage secondary learners through active learning strategies and activities that put the learners at the centre of their learning.			
20.09.22	Joint session 4: Meaningful Assessment (looking forward)			
	In this session we explore tools for 'assessment for learning' so that assessment contributes to learners' progress. We also consider how to use 'unified assessment of literacy' to assess tasks to make sure that students have their achievements recognised across all subjects.
