#### Resources and teaching materials for the Spanish classroom



Current Spanish clearly contains traces of its history. There are many elements that portray the contact and relationship Spanish has had with many other languages throughout the ages: obviously, with Latin and the rest of the Romance languages (French, Italian, Portuguese, Catalan...), but also with other European languages, including English, and with languages such as Arabic or languages from the Americas. Using specific examples, we will see the relationship that Spanish has with other languages and we will show activities to activate general strategies for language learning.







## Tanya Riordan, University of Portsmouth

Tanya Riordan is a Senior Lecturer and the Course Leader for the Postgraduate Certificate in Education for modern foreign languages in the School of Education and has worked there for 21 years. The MFL course has been part of an outstanding programme of teaching and learning (Ofsted 2018).

She aims to raise aspirations and promote access to MFL teaching having worked collaboratively with EU universities. She has bilateral agreements with universities in France: Paris Nanterre, Lille and Caen and Valencia in Spain which allow students from these institutions to apply for a double Franco-British qualification: a Postgraduate Certificate of Education (+ Qualified Teacher Status) as well as a Masters in teaching French or Spanish.



#### Research Interests:

Her research interests include foreign language teaching and learning in the primary and secondary sectors. Her latest research project has focused on developing theoretical concepts that underpin differentiation strategies in the classroom and she has published two articles on this study.



#### Promoting and celebrating the languages spoken within the school

Teachers will experience sharing words and short phrases in their first languages for the rest of the group to listen to and repeat.





Through a Spanish storytelling activity, they will be encouraged to think about strategies that can be used to share a story with people that do not share the same language.

They will also be introduced to translation. This session allows their pupils with English as an Additional Language to select a copy of a book in their first language and to share the story with the rest of the group, whose job in turn is to translate the story into appropriate English and to perform it in front of others, using the strategies identified from sharing the Spanish story.

## Ideas, resources and materials to build your confidence in the Spanish class in Primary



The main goal of this session is to show primary Spanish teachers how to implement their schemes of work in order to: 1) capture students' attention and encourage the use and development of language with a purpose (communicative approach); and 2) contribute to improving teachers' confidence in the Spanish classroom. To this end, we will offer examples of teaching ideas and resources ready to be used in the classroom. We will also share a model for creating texts on current topics (such as SDGs) from which to generate our own materials -focusing on the visual component- with which to teach new vocabulary and grammar. We will end with a guided group dynamic in which we will put the proposed model into practice.
