There are basically two immigration experiences: the experience of the immigrants themselves, and the experience of the community into which the immigrants come.

There are similarly two basic views of immigration in the industrialised countries of the West. Many people welcome immigration from other countries and societies, as this brings cultural diversity. Others, however, feel that this same diversity may lead to social conflict. Immigrants were often first brought to the countries of Western Europe when these countries were enjoying economic strength and needed more workers. But when times are harder, and jobs have become fewer, the 'original' community often feel that jobs rightfully belong to them and not to the 'newcomers'. Under these circumstances, when they detect people who are working around them, but who are in some way clearly different from themselves in religion, the clothes that they wear, the language that they speak, or the colour of their skin, racial prejudice often grows.

The immigrants themselves, and their children, tend to have a simpler view of the immigration experience. For them, the whole process was rather painful: they left behind them a society where they felt at home, and came to a cold, unfriendly, new society where they had to fight harder for the necessities of life than anyone else. They do not see themselves as privileged since they rarely get the best jobs, only the jobs that other people do not want to do.
