Instrucciones generales:

1. READING COMPREHENSION. (4 points)

Do you want to see the Eiffel Tower? Do you dream about the River Thames? Many Chinese people are visiting these places and are experiencing European culture – and they aren't leaving their country.

The River Thames is an important part of life in London. Now there is a River Thames in China, too. It's in Thames Town, a short ride from Shanghai. Thames Town has also got statues of famous British people, guards in red uniforms similar to British guards' uniforms, and streets with British names like High Street, Oxford Street and Queen's Street. There is a British church and British shops and restaurants, but there aren't many people in them. Most Chinese only come to Thames Town to take pictures of their friends and family in front of the buildings.

There's also a French town with a copy of the Eiffel Tower, the Arc de Triomphe and other important buildings. The town is for rich Chinese families, and thousands of people live there. Chinese builders are planning a school and a hospital for them, too. But it doesn't stop there. The Chinese have also got Holland Town next to the sea and they are building a copy of pop star Michael Jackson's home, Neverland, and a copy of Cadaqués, Salvador Dalí's town. They want the Chinese copy of Cadaqués to give Chinese travellers the chance to enjoy the Costa Brava without travelling over 10,000 kilometres.
