1. The University of Granada

The origin of the present University of Granada can be traced back to La Madraza, a place of study founded by Yusuf I in the fourteenth century. Emperor Charles V proposed the formation of a university in 1526; and with the official ratification of Pope Clemente VII in 1531, Granada was established as a university city, open to all peoples, cultures, creeds and ideologies. Since then, the University of Granada has seen its influence grow not only in the social and cultural scene of the city but also at a national and international level. Today, the University of Granada is one of the main universities in Spain and Europe, in student numbers, infrastructure and research. Its rich tradition is reinforced continually with a firm commitment to the future, innovation and quality, a combination which makes it a centre of intellectual reference in all fields of learning: humanistic, scientific-technological, bio-health and legal-social studies. www.ugr.es

2. General Information

The City of Granada

Granada, city of the Alhambra with a population of 270,000, 70,000 of which are students, is located in southern Spain. Just 20 minutes by car from Sierra Nevada, the most important ski resort in southern Europe and an hour from the warm beaches of the Mediterranean. It is a popular tourist destination, renowned for its great cultural diversity and University, founded over 500 years ago.

From a historical point of view, the conquest of Granada in 1492 opened the way for the discovery of the new world, and the embrace of American and European cultures, following periods under Iberian, Roman and later Jewish and Islamic influences. Capital to the ancient Nasrite Kingdom, Granada was the last city in the Iberian Peninsular to fall to the Catholic Monarchs, an event culminating in the formation of Modern Spain. Under Christian rule the city continued to grow in splendour and as a cultural centre, the ideal setting for advances in sciences and humanities. And Granada has other exceptional conditions: historically, it was the last Islamic stronghold in Western Europe (the Alhambra and Generalife are splendid examples of Islamic architecture); Granada is equally a Renaissance city (the Royal Hospital and Cathedral are just two examples of Granada's heritage) and Baroque (Cartuja Monastery or the San Juan de Dios church are two fine examples).

In Granada today, the visitor is constantly surprised by the contrast between old and new, between areas such as the Albayzin or the Alhambra (with its placid corners inspiring memories of times gone by), and the bustling lower part of the city, full of life and colour, of the coming and going of people, with its bars and shops.

On the practical side, those visiting Granada during the summer months when temperatures can reach up to 35 or 40 $^{\circ}$ C, are advised to bring light clothing and sandals. You will find info on Granada on this link https://www.turgranada.es/

3. Courses offered

Spanish Language and Culture Course: teaching methods and the art of teaching

Participants

This course is specially designed for teachers of Spanish as a foreign language, teachers of bilingual programs, immersion programs and of Spanish to Spanish speakers, Grades K - 12, Community College and University teachers from the United States and Canada.

Students must have a minimum Spanish language level of B2 (CEFR), equivalent to *ACTFL Intermediate High or Advanced Low.*

Duration

Dates: 8th – 26th July 2024. A three-week course (60 hours of theory and practice).

Timetable: Four hours a day in the morning from Monday to Friday. Complementary cultural visits and activities in the afternoons and at weekends.

Number of participants per group

Between 15 and 25 participants

OBJECTIVES

- To reflect on methodological aspects applied to teaching and update learning proposals and teaching styles.
- To widen participants' knowledge of current Hispanic culture in its European and American forms
- To improve linguistic competence in Spanish, especially in oral expression.

ASSESSMENT

Attendance (minimum 90%), assignments and active participation in class will be assessed.

Price

1,950€. The price includes 60 teaching hours, cultural activities, medical insurance, three weeks of full-board accommodation. The activities not included and any additional expenses for alternative accommodation and board should be paid directly to the Centro de Lenguas Modernas. The price not including board and accommodation is 1,245€.

Master's Degree in teaching/learning the Spanish language and its culture (Specific degree to the University of Granada)

Participants

This course is specially designed for teachers of Spanish as a foreign language, teachers of bilingual programs, immersion programs and of Spanish to Spanish speakers, Grades K - 12, Community College and University teachers from the United States and Canada.

Participants must have a minimum Spanish language level of C2 (CEFR) or proficiency equivalent to ACTFL Advanced High or Superior.

Duration (20th Edition)

Timetable

Seven and a half hours in morning and afternoon sessions. The cultural visits and activities (6 ECTS) will take place in the evenings and at weekends.

Assessment

Each diploma will be assessed independently by means of assignments, class attendance (minimum 90 %), active participation in class and exams at the end of each module.

Total cost of the Master's degree: (Diplomas I and II): 5,794€



^{**}To obtain these credits, participants are required to justify their assistance or participation in 60 hours of specialised or teacher training courses, conferences or seminars. These may take place in the participants' country of residence or at any Spanish university, including Granada University. The credits must be endorsed by institutions qualified in higher education and have taken place in the last 5 years.

- Specialization Diploma II: 23rd June 25th July 2025: 2,897€

Transport

By plane

The Spanish National airline is Iberia. Their telephone number is 902 400 500 and their web page is http://www.iberia.com/

Your city of arrival in Spain will probably be one of the following:

GRANADA. Airport Information tel.: +34 91 321 10 00. Granada airport is 20 minutes from the city centre. A taxi from the airport to the centre has an approximate cost of 34 €. There is also a private bus service operated by ALSA. For more information, their website is http://www.alsa.es/ and tel.: +34 958 490 164. Departures coincide with the arrival of scheduled flights.

MALAGA. Airport Information tel. +34 91 321 10 00. Malaga is 130 kilometres from Granada. There is now a direct bus from Malaga airport to Granada bus station. The journey takes 2 hours 20 minutes. If you arrive at a time when there is no direct bus, it is faster to catch a bus











from Malaga airport to Malaga bus station and then catch a bus to Granada. The company ALSA (http://www.alsa.es) operates between Malaga and Granada. There are buses to Malaga bus station from the airport every 30 minutes and buses to Granada practically every hour. The last bus leaves at 21:30. Granada bus station is on the outskirts of the city, so you will have to get a taxi or a bus into the centre. A taxi from Malaga to Granada costs around 190 euros.

MADRID. Airport information tel.: +34 91 321 10 00. Madrid is 450 kilometres north of Granada.

It takes just under an hour by plane. There are daily flights with Iberia (http://www.iberia.com/).

By train

The train leaves from Puerta de Atocha train station located on Glorieta de Carlos V, 28045 Madrid.

By bus

Another option is the bus that takes approximately 5 hours. The bus company is called Alsa and their web page is http://www.alsa.es

There is a direct service form Madrid Barajas Terminal 4 twice a day but if it does not coincide with your arrival you will need to go to "Estación Sur" and the nearest tube station is Méndez Álvaro. Buses leave practically every hour. You can buy your tickets from the ALSA window or machine.

Medical insurance

Enrolment in either of these courses entitles participants to medical insurance, valid for the duration of the course. It covers primary medical care, hospitalisation and surgical intervention. Dentist and medicines are not included. It is valid throughout Spanish territory.

Attendance certificate

The University of Granada will issue a certificate to all participants who have attended at least 90% of the programmed classes.

Credits

These courses may be awarded credits by the University of Calfornia San Marcos. Private agencias such as WES also award credits.
