Adult learning challenges in Europe




 There are more than 270 million adult Europeans but only 11.1% of them have a recent learning experience

Share of low-qualified adults in the EU















Conclusions Remaining challenges

- Increase the scale of the action
- Embed more strongly basic skills into skills assessment and training offers targeting low skilled adults
- Improve outreach, guidance and support measures

- Strengthen coordination and partnerships between providers and other stakeholders
- Ensure long-term systemic approach accompanied by appropriate funding resources and mechanisms
